Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."

From the message of St. Pope John Paul II for the 42nd World Day of Prayer for Vocations - April 17, 2005

"Duc in altum!" [*Put out into the deep*] The command of Christ is particularly relevant in our time, when there is a widespread mentality which, in the face of difficulties, favours personal non-commitment. The first condition for "putting out into the deep" is to cultivate a deep spirit of prayer nourished by a daily listening to the Word of God. The authenticity of the Christian life is measured by the depth of one's prayer... In prayer, a conversation with Christ develops and it makes us his intimate friends...

...Prayer also makes us aware that He is also present in moments of apparent failure, when tireless effort seems useless, as happened to the Apostles themselves, who after toiling all night, exclaimed : "Master, we took nothing" (Lk 5,5). Carmelite Corner

Excerpts from *Profiles in Holiness IV*, Prayer and Contemplation in the Life of Bl. Titus Brandsma (1881-1942), by Redemptus M. Valabek, O. Carm, (4 of 7)

The Way of the Cross was another favorite devotion of Bl. Titus. In the two series of meditations he wrote Fr. Titus shows that the mysticism of the passion to which he dedicated himself in his professorial role, was not a mere academic activity, but that he re-lived the same experiences in his concrete life. One example is Jesus contemplated as he falls beneath the weight of the cross for the first time:

"The Omnipotent One is in a state of powerlessness. Our strong God is not up to what is asked of him, he is not up to his confrontation with his executioners. He has run out of strength. My Savior continues, wavering, and suddenly he stumbles and falls. Look at you, O God... They leave you alone for an instant, then they have you lifted up and prod you on to continue. They think they can stimulate your remaining strength by kicking and beating you. They do not realize that you wish to carry the cross with a ready heart and that you wish to show us that this demanded your remaining strength. O holy Exemplar, I now see that when we sink beneath the cross and can go no farther, our powerlessness finds comfort in our fall."
