Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Sunday Reflection

"My father was a wandering Aramean..." Dt 26:2

In today's Old Testament reading, Moses instructs the Israelites to always remember and retell their story when bringing an offering to the temple. The Jewish people came from humble beginnings, descended from a "wandering Aramean," yet they were chosen by God to be a great nation. When they were persecuted and oppressed, God Himself came to their aid and delivered them. They remembered all these things, and offered praise and thanksgiving to the Lord.

Now, we as Christians have been grafted into this family, and the story of the Israelites has become our own story. What does it mean to be called and chosen as children of the Most High God? St. Paul knows what it means. He is a learned scholar of the Law, once a persecutor of the Christians himself. Now, called by Jesus to be an apostle of the Good News, he prays for his beloved people who do not yet believe.

It was to them that the Law was given, to them that the Messiah was promised, but now that Christ has come, they do not know him. They have focused for too long on the "works of the Law," and fail to see the Lawgiver among them. Citing the Scriptures, Paul urges them to open their hearts to believe in Jesus Christ. He prays for them, that they might not lose their inheritance in Christ.

How blessed we are, as Christians, to share in this rich spiritual heritage. Adopted into a family whose roots reach back thousands of years, we have inherited the richness of the Old Testament stories and prophecies, brought to fulfillment in the new. We have a blessed obligation to explore that heritage with the wisdom and understanding God gives us and the guidance of the Church.

This Lent, a good resolution might be to read, study, and pray with Scripture each day, so that we might better understand the connection between that old Jewish story of deliverance from captivity and the new Christian story of deliverance from sin. If we know and remember our past, we too can pass on the story of our salvation to our children, leaving them the greatest legacy of all - the inheritance of faith in Jesus Christ.

Blessed Titus Brandsma, O. Carm, *Spiritual Guide*: portions from "Meditations on the Way of the Cross." Carmelite Press, 2004 (1 of 5)

1st Station: Jesus is Condemned and Led Away

As on a threshing floor, the flail of sin has threshed the Holy Wheat and broken the chaff. Your blood flowed in streams and still seeps from all your wounds. The last drop is not yet spilled.

O God, drive that scandal away from me. I know: "Watch and pray," is the only answer you vouchsafe me. While four hands of executioners roughly and unfeelingly take you away to be crucified, I hear again that "Watch and pray, that you enter not into temptation." My God, I will pray. I will look upon your suffering. I will sound the depths of your love by looking into the depths of your humiliation.

2nd Station: Jesus Takes Up His Cross

O Cross, O Sacred Wood, in the hands of my God heavy indeed, but carried by him with his last reserve of strength, will I not take you upon myself, now that I see that my Jesus precedes and thereby makes it light for my shoulders? O God, I will not only follow your way of the cross; together with you I take up the cross, my cross which you destine for me. Laden with my cross, I will go up with you to the holy mount.

3rd Station: Jesus Falls the First Time

It was necessary that the Christ should bow down, fall, and collapse under the cross and so enter into his glory. His sacred humanity had to be destroyed.... Here we see his strength already fail him. Now I see, O holy model, that when we fall beneath the cross and can go no farther, our powerlessness finds comfort in your fall; that our cross is light compared to yours, as long as we do not threaten to fall beneath it.
