Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Sunday Reflection

"The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs." cf. Psalm 145:16

God is always aware of what we need, and He desires to provide for us in every way, both spiritually and physically. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus directs his disciples to feed a gathered crowd of 5000. Although the disciples have no provisions for the multitude, Andrew finds a small boy who is willing to share his five barley loaves and two fish. Andrew doesn't dismiss the boy's offering, but presents it to Jesus, who blesses it and multiplies it. The loaves and fishes miraculously feed all those who are gathered, with enough left over to fill twelve baskets. Because of the generosity of a child, the faith of a disciple, and the blessing of God, the crowd was fed that day long ago, as we too are fed and nourished by the hand of the Lord, who provides for us with His own Body and Blood in the Eucharistic banquet.

St. John Paul II, in his 1982 Address to the Young People of Scotland, reflects on how young people, like the little boy in the Gospel, can make a difference by offering their own lives and gifts:

"Saint Andrew gave Jesus all there was available, and Jesus miraculously fed those five thousand people and still had something left over. It is exactly the same with your lives. Left alone to face the difficult challenges of life today, you feel conscious of your inadequacy and afraid of what the future may hold for you. But what I say to you is this: place your lives in the hands of Jesus. He will accept you, and bless you, and he will make such use of your lives as will be beyond your greatest expectations! In other words: surrender yourselves, like so many loaves and fishes, into the all-powerful, sustaining hands of God and you will find yourselves transformed with "newness of life", with fullness of life."

What do you have to offer to Jesus today? Whatever it is - the child's loaves and fishes, the widow's last few pennies, or your own prayers, works, joys and sufferings - give it generously, without counting the cost, and trust Jesus to multiply your humble gift beyond all imagining.

Some people believe that God’s will is subjective, and it exists independently of our desires, feelings, history, choices, and relationships. On the other extreme, some believe that whatever we do to fulfill our own desires or potential, and attain happiness, is God’s will. Ignatian discernment says that God’s will manifests itself in a person’s desires and struggles. God’s will is something we can know, but because we are sinners with flawed minds and wayward hearts, we can get mixed up. Ignatian discernment teaches us ways to free ourselves from attachments that lead us away from God, or confuse our ability to hear God’s voice. Ignatian discernment holds that we can follow God’s will not because of will power, but because we learn how to become the kind of person we were meant to be.

Carmelites Ministering to the World:

Bl. Titus Brandsma, O. Carm (1881-1942) excerpts from *Carmelite Martyr, Friar Against Fascism* by Leopold G. Glueckert, O. Carm.; (4 of 14) Used with permission of Carmelite Media

As a future opponent of the Nazis, Titus Brandsma would exert wide influence (in assisting)... the earliest concern of (the Dutch) bishops to protect their religious liberty and freedom of action.

Even before the Nazi invasion of the Netherlands, the tightly organized Dutch Church, backed by its newspapers and schools, had resisted Fascist ideas and programs at the intellectual level. The "Dutch Nazis" were the N.S.B. or Nationaal-Socialistische Beweging der Nederlanden (National Socialist Movement of the Netherlands).

Founded in 1931 by Anton Mussert, the (N.S.B.) party still held only 4 seats in parliament by 1939, representing a mere 4.2% of the votes cast....In theory, the N.S.B. favored religious freedom, as long as the churches made no attempts to influence social or political policy.
