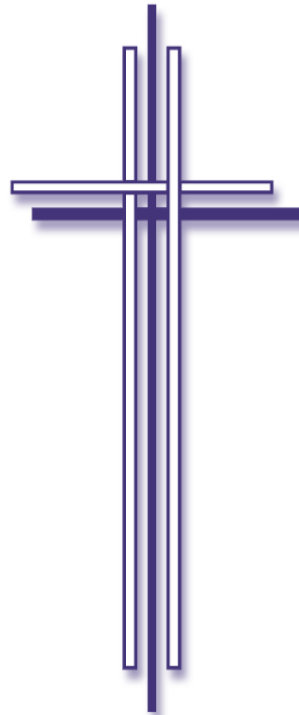

**Sacrament of Baptism:** is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

**Celebration of Christian Funeral:** After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

**Christian Initiation of Adults:** Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

**Christian Initiation of Children (CIC):** We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

## Sunday Reflection

*"My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." 2 Cor 12:8*

In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul speaks of "a thorn in the flesh" that he has begged the Lord to remove, to no avail. Paul doesn't spell out exactly what he is struggling with, but the Lord answers, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." Paul must rely on God's strength and not his own, because Satan is defeated only by the power of God. Paul is happy to bear this "thorn" along with all the suffering, persecutions, insults, and hardships he has faced for the sake of Christ, knowing that he will never be overcome if he trusts in the power of God.

The Lord's answer can provide hope to all of us when we're struggling with thorny issues in our own lives. At those times when we are trying to accomplish something and failing, despite trying with all our strength, this reassuring message reminds us to lean on God's strength and not our own, because it is only through His power that we can do anything at all.

When we fix our eyes on the Lord and plead for His mercy, as the psalmist says, everything is possible. Turn to God and trust in His power. The Lord is not always going to make things easy for us, and He may not take away the obstacles and challenges we face, but He is always willing to work miracles of grace in our lives if we have faith in His power and mercy.

In today's Gospel, just the opposite happens. When Jesus visits His own hometown, his neighbors, who knew Him as a carpenter, refuse to believe in His power. Their lack of faith prevents them from receiving the miracles of healing and grace that Jesus desires to bestow on them. We, on the other hand, have the advantage of knowing the truth about Jesus: that He is God Incarnate, all powerful and all loving. When we are weak, we know we can trust in His infinite strength and depend on Him to care for us.

## PEACE AND JUSTICE REFLECTION

***If you want peace, work for justice. — Pope Paul VI***  
**Message for World Day of Peace (January 1, 1972)**

*Jack Jezreel, the founder of JustFaith Ministries, writes about six crucial ingredients for Christianity to be an effective force for peace and justice, "peace with justice, justice with peace." Every week we'll explore two of the six elements.*

### 1. Relationships with Those at Risk

First, the Church—the People of God—must always be deliberate about our relationships with those who are at risk in the world. . . . The single biggest obstacle to the church's mission and vision of peace with justice is the fact of the segregation of the poor/the oppressed/the exploited/the neglected/the stranger from the comfortable/the secure/the satisfied. The result is a divide that convinces the comfortable and secure that all is well and persuades the poor that there is no hope. . . .

Regardless of what else we do, we must stay connected in some kind of face-to-face way with the persons and the places at risk. . . .

### 2. Justice Education

The second critical ingredient . . . is justice education. . . . The single most repeated phrase in the Gospels is [what] Jesus uses to describe the vision and focus of his ministry: the Reign of God. . . . This is the reign of service, reconciliation, justice, generosity, compassion and peacemaking. Jesus calls disciples to *this vision*. Is it fair to say that Jesus did not call disciples to follow him for the purpose of idolizing or honoring him? Rather, the reason to follow him is that he is pointing toward a new possibility—a holy possibility. . . .

Catholic social teaching speaks to dignity, solidarity, the option for the poor, the rights of workers, care of creation, peace and so on. It is, in fact, an extraordinary tradition. The only problem is that it is so often not integrated in the life of the local faith community, the parish. It is, to use a tiresome and now pathetic phrase, "our best kept secret." . . .

**Ignatian Spirituality**

The Spiritual Exercises are a compilation of meditations, prayers, and contemplative practices developed by St. Ignatius Loyola to help people deepen their relationship with God. Through the Spiritual Exercises, we learn Ignatian Spirituality, which teaches us to focus on our choices and life in the present moment, here and now. It is not always easy to do, right? We want to look at the past to see what we've done before, or the future to see where we wish we could be. But God is "I AM." With Ignatian spirituality, we pray for the ability to listen to God in the moment, to hear our own emotions, fears, drives, and attachments, and sort them out from God's desires. As we do so, we discover how much God loves us even though we are dust. We discover where and how we are called.

**Carmelite Corner**

**Carmelites Ministering to the World:**

On January 19, 1942, Nazi secret police arrested Titus Brandsma, a Dutch Carmelite priest. After extensive interrogation, they labeled him a "most dangerous man."

He was sentenced to the infamous concentration camp at Dachau, where he was executed on July 26, 1942. His ashes were buried in Dachau's "Grave of Unknown Thousands."

Today he is remembered and honored throughout the world. On November 3, 1985 Pope John Paul II proclaimed Titus Brandsma Blessed and Martyr at St. Peter's in Rome. This is the story of his resistance against the Nazis.
