Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

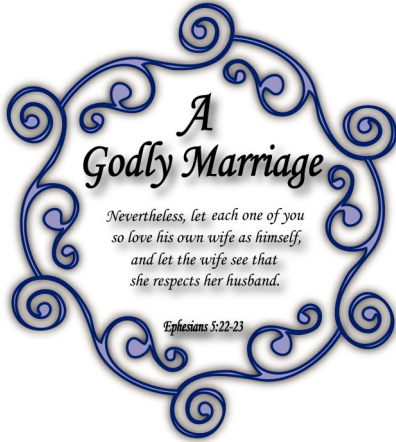

Sunday Reflection

"...from the beginning... God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife and the two shall become one flesh." Mk 10:6-8

From his earliest days as a parish priest, St. John Paul II "fell in love with human love" perceiving in marital love the reflection of God's love for His Bride, the Church. When he became pope, John Paul began to introduce this rich theological interpretation, now known as the theology of the body, to the whole world. Exploring the meaning of the passages we hear read today from the creation story in Genesis, which are reaffirmed by Jesus in today's Gospel, St. John Paul taught that the human body, male and female, is imprinted "*from the beginning*" with God's image, and that the marital union prefigures the divine union of God and His Bride, the Church.

His theology lifts human love up to what God intended it to be, the fruitful, lifelong union of a man and woman in marriage. The man is intended to image God in his self-giving sacrificial love; the human father meant to reflect the image of the Father in heaven, giving even his life for the beloved, his spouse. The woman is intended to receive the gift of love from her husband in the marital embrace which brings forth life, the human mother reflecting the Bride of Christ, the Church, and together the two become co-creators with God.

In her article, "*The Theology of Human Love*," Joan Frawley Desmond relates that John Paul's teaching came at a pivotal moment in recent church history, "In September 1979, with the sexual revolution in full swing and influential Catholic theologians sustaining a full attack against *Humanae Vitae*... Pope John Paul II began a series of reflections that reframed and revitalized the Church's message on the meaning and purpose of human sexuality...The first Polish pope wanted to bring his flock back to the "beginning," because that is how Jesus responded to the Pharisees' questions about his opposition to divorce: "*In the beginning, it was not so.*" ... John Paul's insights... affirmed the "inseparable connection... between the unitive and procreative significance of the marriage act."

Carmelites Ministering to the World:

Bl. Titus Brandsma, O. Carm (1881-1942) excerpts from *Carmelite Martyr, Friar Against Fascism* by Leopold G. Glueckert, O. Carm. (14 of 14)

For Titus Brandsma, resistance to injustice on principle was an easy development of his earlier life. A nation of individualists, like his own, could always resist a tyrant, but did so most effectively with good leadership. Both Protestant and Catholic churches had provided such leadershipEven today, Brandsma is considered one of the heroes of the national resistance at all levels of society....

As he refused to accept N.S.B. propaganda for the papers, he defended the principle of freedom of conscience...By making such a refusal illegal on *grounds of principle*, the Nazis themselves had made the question one of a *universal* principle, as Titus was quick to point out in his letter.

According to the N.S.B's own records, Titus was considered one of the most dangerous men in the country because of his work for the Catholic schools, his defense of the Jews, and his activity at the university.

Free exercise of religion and its practical consequences brought him to direct conflict with the N.S.B....he would make no compromises, no trade-offs with their doctrine. And if it came to a question of life or death, he was quite willing to die.
