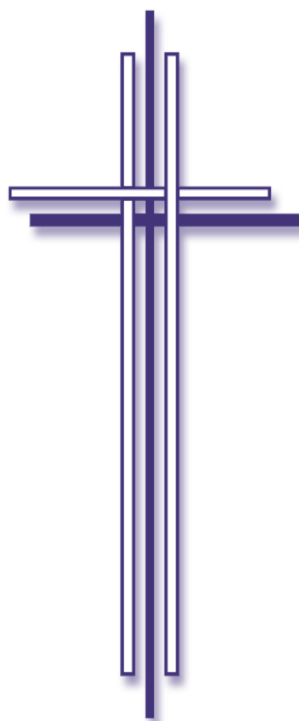

Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Sunday Reflection

"... if you trust in God, you too shall live; he has set before you fire and water to whichever you choose, stretch forth your hand. Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him." Sir 15:15-16

The readings today couldn't be any clearer on the importance of following God's commandments. The Old Testament reading reminds us that we are given the choice between good and evil; life and death. It is up to us to reject sin and evil and choose life. The psalmist sings his gratitude for the great graces and blessings given to those who follow God's laws. St. Paul speaks of the wisdom of God, which will bring blessings beyond human comprehension to those who love God. Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus tells us to go beyond just following the letter of the law and warns of the consequences of refusing or failing to do so, even in our hearts. Sin does more damage to the human soul than the loss of physical abilities. Whatever causes us to sin must be cut off, because there are eternal consequences.

The Lord's warnings may sound harsh, until we recall that He also has given us the path to eternal life and the grace of redemption, by His death and resurrection. Jesus provides all we need to overcome our human weaknesses and offers us infinite mercy when we fail. All we have to do is turn to Him and ask for forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This sacrament washes away all sin, strengthens us to resist temptation, and awakens in us the desire to be more faithful to God's holy will.

So we have an invitation and a choice. Which of us, if we truly understood what we are being offered, would reject the beautiful, life-giving, commandments of God? God is calling us to open our hearts to His mysterious, hidden wisdom, to reject the "wisdom of this age," so that someday, we will see the beauty and the glory of "what God has prepared for those who love Him."

Thoughts from Thomas Keating

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.—Matthew 5:9

Before you speak of peace, you must first have it in your heart.—St. Francis of Assisi

Authentic spirituality is always first about *you*—about allowing your own heart and mind to be changed. It's about getting your own *who right*. *Who* is it that is doing the perceiving? Is it your illusory, separate, false self; or is it your True Self, who you are in God?

Thomas Keating (1923–2018) wrote:

We're all like localized vibrations of the infinite goodness of God's presence. So love is our very nature. Love is our first, middle, and last name. Love is all; not [love as] sentimentality, but love that is self-forgetful and free of self-interest.

Ignatian Spirituality

Ignatius was a firm believer in communication. He wrote hundreds of letters, and insisted that the Jesuits in his Company make monthly reports from mission territories. He even installed the first printing press in Rome. So it's no surprise that he believed in good communication with God. Through praying the Exercises, we notice how God works within us (interior "movements" or feelings), and without (events in the day). "Noticing" alerts us to the various ways in which God communicates with us moment by moment throughout our day. Listening to feelings and movements is the way in which we hear God communicating with us.

Ten Day Spiritual Retreat by Titus Brandsma

{5 of 18}
with Meditations on the Bl. Virgin Mary Leading to Intimacy with Jesus; taken from *Essays on Titus Brandsma*; Carmelite Media 2004 pp. 247-261

Day II of Retreat: Meditations
Resolution 1: Conversion. Keep our eyes fixed on God. We cannot serve two lords. Far from us all double-dealing, all hypocrisy. We commit ourselves to God joyously and gratefully. Do all that is to be done in his service, to fulfill his will in everything.
Resolution 2: In our weakness, we shall seek our help from God, preferably through the Blessed Sacrament. Here strengthen ourselves every day anew for that one day. "Give us this day our daily bread." Consider our life as a march through the desert toward Horeb to see God there. The future possession and contemplation of God can give our life a new and more pleasing aspect.
Resolution 3: Often remember that God loved us from all eternity, ab aeterno, and has willed to create us. To assure our salvation, he has also willed Mary's Immaculate Conception, ab aeterno. We should see ourselves united to Mary in the eternal plan of God. Frequently humiliate ourselves before God for having despised his love. Invoke and praise the divine mercy. Rejoice in the Immaculate Conception and for the Nativity of Our Lady, as a foreshadowing of our redemption and eternal salvation.
