



Sunday Reflection

The Word of God became flesh and dwelt among us. To those who accepted him, He gave power to become children of God. Alleluia! Jn. 1:14A, 12A

In today's readings, Jesus is proclaimed as Lamb of God, and Son of God. John the Baptist knew that this was the promised Messiah, who had come to take away the sins of the world. Through Jesus, we are all invited to become children of God in baptism, adopted by a loving Father. This is the baptism with the Holy Spirit that John speaks about.

What a miraculous gift and treasure! Sometimes we may forget just how miraculous it is; that we in our sinful and imperfect state can be made pure and become children of God. Ten Day Spiritual Retreat by Titus Brandsma {1 of 18}

with Meditations on the Bl. Virgin Mary Leading to Intimacy with Jesus; taken from Essays on Titus Brandsma; Carmelite Media 2004 pp. 247-261

Introduction to Blessed Titus Brandsma: 1881, Feb 23: Born in Northern Holland 1905, June 17: Ordained a Carmelite Priest 1906-1942: Held various positions in teaching as a Professor of Philosophy and Carmelite Spirituality; was appointed spiritual advisor of the Roman Catholic Association of Journalists in 1935; lectured against Nazism; supported Catholic Schools; encouraged Dutch Catholic newspapers to resist printing Nazi propaganda which led to his arrest. On January 19, 1942, Nazi secret police arrested Titus Brandsma, after extensive interrogation, they labeled him a "most dangerous man." Following confinement in various prison camps he arrived at Dachau on July 19; he was executed on July 26, 1942.

On November 3, 1985 Pope John Paul II proclaimed Titus Brandsma Blessed and Martyr at St. Peter's in
