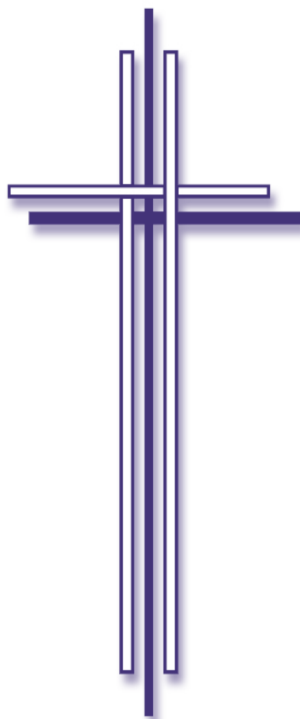

Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Why We Ask for Registrations: Some are nervous about giving us their name(s) when they register for a live Mass or reconciliation. We collect names for the purpose of contact tracing (that is, if someone attends the same event you do and tests positive for COVID 19, we'll be notified and can let you know that you may have been exposed). It is a matter of taking care of each other. We shred registrants' names after two weeks. We're doing our best to minister to you and comply with the health regulations at the same time

Sunday Reflection

"Brothers and sisters: I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us. For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of God. We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies." Romans 8:18-23

In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul reminds his readers that this life is not the end; that God's infinite glory and freedom awaits all the children of God who are suffering now. As the headlines bring us daily reports of violence, conflict, anger, and hatred, Christians need this reminder once again. The Word of God, which the Lord promises will accomplish what He has sent it to do, goes forth like the rain upon the earth, watering the ground and bringing forth good fruit. All the world's corruption and pain can't change that or stop it. God has already won the victory for us.

Our job as Christians has not changed over the centuries. We are called to proclaim the Gospel in season and out of season, speaking the truth with courage, love, and faith. We are promised the gift of the Holy Spirit: pray every morning for God to pour out His Holy Spirit upon you. We are adopted by the most loving and powerful Father, our God: open your heart each day to His will in your life, asking in prayer for His guidance. We are given the incredible gift of Jesus Christ's life and death to sustain us: trust completely in Him and turn to Him in each moment, surrender your will to His, take up your cross and follow Him without fear. Open your eyes and see. Open your ears to hear. Open your heart to love.

Lord, give me this seeing faith. Then my work will never be monotonous, I will ever find a new joy in humoring and gratifying the fancies and wishes of all the aged. O beloved sick, how doubly dear you are to me when you personify Christ, and what a privilege is mine to be allowed to nurse you.

"Sweetest Lord, make me appreciate my noble vocation and its many responsibilities. Never permit me to disgrace it by giving way to coldness, unkindness, or impatience.

"And, my God, whilst Thou art Jesus my Patient, deign also to be my patient Jesus, bearing with my many faults, looking only to my intention, which is always to love and serve Thee in the person of each and every one of the aged. Lord, increase my faith, bless my efforts, and sanctify my work for the aged and infirm."

In this current atmosphere of uncertainty and change, Mother Angeline's elevation to Venerable speaks forcefully to the importance of protecting human life from conception to natural death. As she advocated for the elderly all her life, those who now learn of her mission must do the same and can pray to her to intercede for the elderly.
