**Sacrament of Baptism:** is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

**Celebration of Christian Funeral:** After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

**Christian Initiation of Adults:** Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

**Christian Initiation of Children (CIC):** We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

### Sharing Tree News

Christmas is coming early this year! Well, not for everyone, but it will be for the recipients of your Sharing Tree generosity. We will deliver gifts and food to local St. Vincent de Paul families on Saturday, Dec. 14.



This annual holiday ministry provides gifts and food to needy families and seniors helped by CK St. Vincent's, Elijah Family Homes, and Catholic Charities. This year we are also helping with gifts for P-CAP (Parent-Child Assistance Program), an off-shoot of Elijah Family Homes. They help mothers who are past substance abusers and their children from pregnancy to age 3; they work with moms to prevent future drug-affected births.

Last year you gave gifts to over 900 children and gift cards to 185 seniors. The Sharing Tree is an amazing program!

To participate, look for the display boards in the church foyer from Nov. 23 till Dec. 10. Cards indicate a gift for a boy, girl, or senior. We also need gift wrap and tape. Select one or several cards. Purchase a new **unwrapped** toy or a gift card, attach it to the card you've chosen, then give them to one of the families collecting gifts before all Masses the weekends of Nov. 30/Dec. 1 and Dec. 7/8. **NO CLOTHES** please – we don't know the sizes of anyone receiving your gift.

**Gift cards are an excellent donation:** they can go to seniors as well as teens. **We request that you purchase gift cards in denominations of \$25 or less.** We can especially use gift cards from stores that sell food, clothes, and toys.

In addition to gift cards or toys, we invite you to contribute toiletry items such as bar soap, anti-perspirant, shampoo, conditioner, lotion, toothpaste, dish soap, laundry detergent, chlorine-free multi-purpose cleaner, toilet paper, facial tissue and paper towels. These items can be placed in the decorated baskets in the church foyer.

Gifts and toiletries will be distributed along with food baskets to families on December 14 so donations cannot be used after December 13.

## Sunday Reflection

*"As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy! ... Jesus, I trust in You, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world."*

*From the last message of John Paul II, shared posthumously on Divine Mercy Sunday, 2005*

Just three years ago, the Year of Mercy was coming to a close. Yet even now, the Lord continues to extend His mercy to the world, while also warning us that time is short. In today's readings, Jesus tells His disciples not to fear or be fooled by rumors of the end, but to be prepared. He warns that we will face great persecution but also promises to come to our defense. Although these persecutors "will put some of you to death..." Jesus promises that, "not a hair on your head will be destroyed." Death has no power over those who turn to the mercy of God. They need not fear His terrible Justice. Instead, for them, "there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays."

From ancient times, we were warned that the Day of Justice would come. Yet we sometimes grow lazy, forgetting to work and persevere as we await the fulfillment of that fearsome promise. We should never forget that time is short.

Jesus's promise - and His warning - was renewed in a series of messages given to St. Faustina Kowalska about the Divine Mercy. Jesus asked St. Faustina to "tell all souls about this great mercy of mine, because the awful day, the day of My justice is near" (*Divine Mercy in My Soul, 965*). This time of mercy has been extended so that all sinners would have a chance to turn to the Lord and be saved. The Lord is with us now: in the Eucharist, in the healing Sacrament of Reconciliation, and in Church teachings and Scripture. Jesus so loves us and desires our salvation that He gave us the extraordinary gift of the Divine Mercy messages. Listen to Him; turn to His Mercy. Now is the time.

**Please Pray For:**

**Ignatian Spirituality**

In his Exercises, St. Ignatius outlined a prayer called the Daily Examen. It has five simple points, but is so useful and powerful that Ignatius told his men, if they prayed nothing else, they should pray the Examen. The five points are: 1) Be grateful for God's blessings. 2) Ask the Holy Spirit to help. 3) Review your day to discover times when you noticed God, and the times when you left God out. 4) Express sorrow for your sins and ask for God's forgiveness. 5) Pray for the grace to be open to God tomorrow. The Examen takes about five minutes to pray, yet makes a huge difference in the lives of anyone who prays it regularly. Go ahead and try it yourself.
