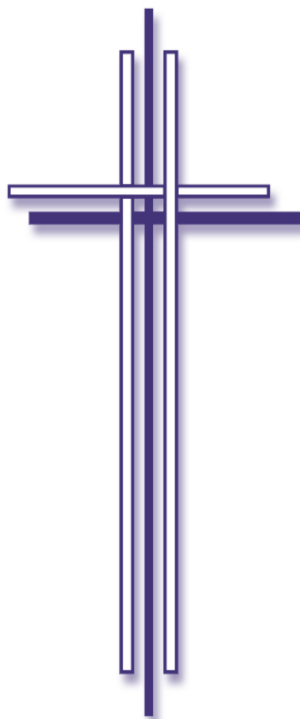

Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Sunday Reflection

"Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? – Mt. 18:21

One of the most amazing stories of forgiveness I've ever heard was told by Immaculée Ilibagiza, a survivor of the Rwandan genocide of 1994, in her book, "Left to Tell." She spent three months hiding in a tiny bathroom with seven other starving women, as her family members and fellow Tutsi tribe members were slaughtered in the genocide that killed a million people. She survived by praying the rosary continually, saying, "Prayer became my armor, and I wrapped it tightly around my heart."

Yet she encountered difficulty with the words of the Lord 's Prayer, finding herself unable to say "*forgive us as we forgive others.*" She remembers, "It was no use - my prayers felt hollow. A war had started in my soul, and I could no longer pray to a God of love with a heart full of hatred.... I tried again, praying for Him to forgive the killers, but deep down I couldn't believe that they deserved it at all. It tormented me... I tried to pray for them myself, but I felt like I was praying for the devil... I asked God to help me, and again I heard his voice: Forgive them; they know not what they do..."

"I took a crucial step toward forgiving the killers that day. My anger was draining from me - I'd opened my heart to God, and He'd touched it with His infinite love. For the first time, I pitied the killers. I asked God to forgive their sins and turn their souls toward His beautiful light... That night I prayed with a clear conscience and a clean heart. For the first time since I entered the bathroom, I slept in peace."

May each of us also find the grace and peace that comes from forgiving those who have sinned against us.

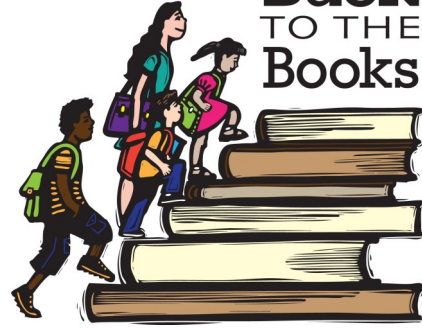

Carmelites Ministering to the World:

St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein, 1891-1942) OCD, nun; martyr excerpts from www.vatican...edith_stein; *The Four Teresas:* Gina Loehr, and *Springs of Carmel:* Peter Slattery {5 of 14}



Surrendering her brilliant mind to the wisdom of God was difficult and humbling for Edith. Yet she never regretted choosing the obedience of faith. The insights of faith offered her mind an abundance of new material for reflection.

On January 1, 1922 Edith was baptized into the Catholic faith. Her conversion from Judaism brought a rift between her and her family. This pain in following God's call was a challenging cross for her to bear.

Immediately after her conversion, she wanted to join a Carmelite convent; however, that would come later. Meanwhile, during the in-between years (1922-1931), Edith taught at the Dominican Sister's school and St. Magdalen's Convent in Speyer.

She was encouraged to and did accept extensive speaking engagements, mainly on women's issues and role in the culture and in the Catholic Church. These experiences were to teach Edith that the "deeper someone is drawn to God, the more he has to get beyond himself, that is, go into the world and carry divine life into it."

She successfully combined scholarship and faith in her philosophical works and her teaching, seeking to be "a tool of the Lord" in everything she taught.

About This Sunday

Exaltation of the Cross

(Note: in the Diocese of Yakima only, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross has been moved to Sunday, Sept. 13 and the memorial of St. John Chrysostom to Monday, Sept. 14.)

What is the history behind feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross?

Emperor Constantine's mother, Helena, is credited with having discovered the true cross around 330. She traveled to the Holy Land and uncovered the places associated with Jesus' life. Legend has it that Helena uncovered three crosses but was not able to detect the true cross until each of them was laid on a leper. Only one of them cured the leper, proving it to be the true cross. A great church was built at the site, and soon various portions of the cross were sent to other churches as relics to be venerated.

The day after the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, September 14, 335, the actual cross was displayed for veneration. Egeria, a women traveler to Jerusalem around the year 386, kept a diary that has survived. She tells of the unique veneration of the wood of the cross that took place on Good Friday, something maintained ritually to this very day.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross focuses on the gift of love that Jesus manifested by his total gift of self, offered for all. The cross, the ultimate form of capital punishment in its day, has become for us the ultimate symbol of love and triumph over evil and death.

We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world.
