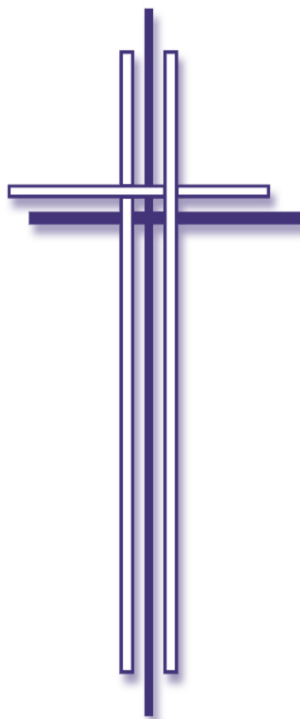

Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Service: reach out to neighbors, family, and friends. Offer to run errands, supply essentials, and visit on the phone. Social distancing is only a physical separation.

Sunday Reflection

"We have to do the works of the one who sent me while it is day. Night is coming when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." Jn 8:12

Times seem especially dark right now. For the first time in the 2000 years of the Catholic Church, public masses have ceased in Rome. Churches have closed their doors. Now in our own Yakima Diocese, masses have been cancelled - for the remainder of Lent, for Good Friday, for Easter Sunday. Many people around the world are already suffering from the Coronavirus, while the rest of us dread its possible impact in our own communities. An invisible enemy is surely difficult to fight.

At the same time, I've been reading hopeful social media posts. In Italy, people are coming out on their balconies to sing together. In China, a woman posts about her experience under quarantine for seven weeks, praising God for hearing birdsong in the quiet, time with her family, and help from her neighbors. In western Washington, a young mother posts a video, filmed on her phone in the dark of morning. Her husband is quarantined in his bedroom after an exposure to Coronavirus at work. Unafraid, she tells us, "God has got this," while reading a scripture passage from Isaiah, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who lived in a land of gloom a light has shone" (Is 9:1).

The light of Christ cannot be dimmed. My heart is broken to be unable to receive the Eucharist but we have to believe that God *has* got this. Masses are broadcast online and on television by EWTN and other sources. Find one. Pray. Make a spiritual communion. Read scripture. And always remember, Jesus said, "Be not afraid... I am with you until the end of time" (cf Jn 6:20; Mt. 28:20).

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Ten Day Spiritual Retreat by Titus Brandsma

{10 of 18}
with Meditations on the Bl. Virgin Mary Leading to Intimacy with Jesus; taken from *Essays on Titus Brandsma*; Carmelite Media 2004 pp. 247-261

Day VII of Retreat: Meditations {1 of 4}
Resolution 1: Do not run away from sufferings; put up with scorn. These unite us to Jesus and make us understand the meaning of sorrow. With Mary, go to encounter Jesus on the Way of the Cross. In suffering, be united to Mary; model our life on hers, in order to share in her generosity. Take advantage of the opportunities we find to meditate on the Passion of the Lord. In order to make the Way of the Cross, pay special attention to the crucifix in our rooms and where we work.

Meditation 2: Episode-The Bl. Virgin under the cross; For the space of three hours, beneath the cross on which Jesus is agonizing in indescribable pain: Go and see Jesus with Mary. "Learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart." (Mt. 11:29)

Teachings contained in this episode:
1- The death of Jesus: final, supreme manifestation of his love. Often take our place with Mary and John beneath the cross to meditate on the sacred passion. Jesus tells us: "When I shall be raised up from the earth, I shall draw all towards me" (Jn 12:32).
2- Unite ourselves to Jesus in his death. Unite our death to his, unite our sacrifice to his. "Into your hands I commend my spirit" (Lk 23:46).
