Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Food baskets and the Sharing Tree are our school and parish holiday programs to help families in need who live in Richland, West Richland, and Benton City. They are given to our St. Vincent de Paul clients, Catholic Charities senior citizens, foster kids and others, and Elijah Family Homes kids. Our school, St. Vincent de Paul conference, and Parish Council are asking for donations of gift and grocery cards and high-protein non-perishable food.



The Sharing Tree moved away from your donated toys to gift cards during the pandemic years. The response was so favorable that we've decided to make the change permanent.

Food Baskets will include both grocery gift cards and high-protein non-perishable food. Our school students have always played a major role in collecting items for the food baskets. This year, they will collect food items and grocery gift cards; they will also sort, and pre-box donated food.

No toiletries or cleaning supplies will be collected. Families will be given your donated grocery gift cards to purchase these items and perishables.

Spiritual Practices

Ignatian Spirituality

In his Spiritual Exercises, St. Ignatius outlined a prayer called the Daily Examen. It has five simple points, but is so useful and powerful that Ignatius told his men that the Examen was most important. The five points are: 1) Be grateful for God's blessings. 2) Ask the Holy Spirit to help. 3) Review your day to discover times when you noticed God, and the times when you left God out. 4) Express sorrow for your sins and ask for God's forgiveness. 5) Pray for the grace to be open to God tomorrow. The Examen takes about five minutes to pray, yet makes a huge difference in the lives of anyone who prays it regularly. Go ahead and try it yourself.

In Chapter 57 of his Rule, St. Benedict talks about the work of artisans in the monastery. Like the worthy wife in Proverbs, like the good stewards of the master's 'talents' in the Gospel, the artisans included those whose work supplied basic needs (food, clothing, shelter, and income) and created works of art to inspire and educate. The worthy wife and the wise stewards in today's scriptures, and the artisans found worthy of praise from St. Benedict, all recognize that their talents are given and used for the glory of God.

Carmelite Corner

Excerpts from Chapter 13, Carmel and the Eucharist, Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey, edited by Johan Bergstrom-Allen, TOC, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

Mary: woman of the Eucharist

Carmelites take inspiration from the Virgin Mary because in her Fiat declaration ('Yes, let it be so!') we see her accept the will of God regardless of the unforeseen consequences. As Mary's pregnancy progressed her love for Jesus grew. When she visited Elizabeth her cousin, Mary proclaimed her 'Eucharist' or thanksgiving in the Magnificat: 'My soul glorifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior' (Luke 1:46-55).

As we receive the Eucharist we become like Mary: the Word becomes flesh within us, he grows within us, we ponder the greatness of God, we are open to his marvelous works, and we sing a hymn of thanksgiving.

St. Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi (1566-1607) knew that communion was an encounter with the Triune God, saying 'O sisters! If we would only comprehend the fact that while the Eucharistic species remains within us, Jesus is there working in us inseparably with the Father and the Holy Spirit and therefore the whole Holy Trinity is there.'

Sunday Reflection

What Remains

When my grandfather died, my parents, siblings, and I were left with the question: what's to become of the house?

Anyone who has inherited property knows that it's not simply a matter of assuming ownership of a plot of land upon which sits four walls and a roof. Those four walls and a roof usually contain memories and objects — an enormous volume of both, in the case of my grandfather. When they're left to you, you have to sift through them, the memories and the objects, and with each one you have to think: Is it worth it? Do I keep it? Will I need it?

And slowly, painfully, you disassemble the physical existence of the person who lived here. You accept, with a pang, that most of it must be given away or discarded. You cry when you bag up the clothes to take to Goodwill. You can't even bear to look when they break the piano into a hundred pieces and throw it in a dumpster, realizing that no one wants or has a use for something that was once so precious.

But when you come upon a rosary that was used so many times it has begun to fall apart, you don't even think twice before keeping it, and not because you need the rosary. You need what it means. You need what it reminds you of.

When all is said and done, each of us will be called before our master to settle accounts, just as my grandfather was.

"Where are the gifts I gave you? What remains of the fortune to which I entrusted you?" he will ask us. "What have you done with the peace? What have you done with the love? What have you done with the mercy?"
