Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

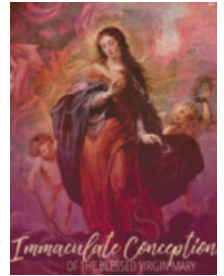

Our Food Baskets and Sharing Tree Season is Here!

Collection of gift cards and groceries is well under way but **we can always use more!** Please remember needy families that are served by our St. Vincent de Paul Society, Catholic Charities, and Elijah Family Homes when you do your Christmas shopping.

We must have your donations no later than December 11 for delivery on December 16.

The Sharing Tree moved away from your donated toys to gift cards during the pandemic years. The response was so favorable that we've decided to make the change permanent.

Food Baskets will include both grocery gift cards and high-protein non-perishable food. Our school students have always played a major role in collecting items for the food baskets. This year, they will collect food items and grocery gift cards; they will also sort, and pre-box donated food.

No toiletries or cleaning supplies will be collected. Families will be given your donated grocery gift cards to purchase these items and perishables.

Spiritual Practices

Ignatian Spirituality

Our world is full of suffering and evil. The Christian term for this disorder is sin. In his autobiography, Ignatius described himself as scrupulous about his sinfulness. The only way he could escape his scrupulosity was to embrace the mercy of God. He explained that sin can be seen through two prisms: 1) Lack of gratitude in the face of God's continuing gifts. 2) Lack of reverence for God. During Advent, the church, as well as the Spiritual Exercises, focus on sin and forgiveness, and preparing for Christ's coming. Through prayer, we try to uncover ways that we lack reverence or gratitude - how we are pulled from God toward self. As we do so, the Spiritual Exercises direct us to ask for two graces: Shame that we've hurt God through our sinfulness, and confusion that we could still sin, even as we are so loved.

The next meeting of the Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Life (SEEL) will be December 9 at 9 a.m. at the Parish of the Holy Spirit and on Zoom online. The theme will be Christ's Kingdom. To learn more about SEEL, please visit <https://seeltc.com>.

Benedictine Spirituality

Chapter 52 of the Rule of St. Benedict talks about the 'oratory,' the place where monks pray the Divine Office together. Outside the community prayer, the oratory is to be maintained in silence for personal prayer. Carmelite Corner

Excerpts from Chapter 13, Carmel and the Eucharist, Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey, edited by Johan Bergstrom-Allen, TOC, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

St. Teresa and the Eucharist:

In St. Teresa's book *The Way of Perfection* (Chapter 34) Teresa tells us that by the gift of the Blessed Sacrament Jesus remains with us to 'help, encourage and sustain us in doing God's will'. Jesus has given us 'the manna and nourishment of his humanity that we might find him' and that 'He is teaching us to set our wills on heavenly things'.

St. Teresa was in no doubt that the presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is a powerful source of healing - spiritual; emotional, even physical healing. She says, '...if when Christ went about in the world the mere touch of his robes cured the sick, why doubt, if we have faith, that miracles will be worked while he is within us and that he will give what we ask of him, since he is in our house? His Majesty is not accustomed to paying poorly for his lodging if the hospitality is good (*Way of Perfection*, Chapter 34; 8)

Sunday Reflection

Memento Mori

Just this week, my husband and I signed our wills, and the lawyer was careful to couch our transaction in gentle, abstract language: "When we lose you" she kept saying, instead of "When you die."

It's very uncomfortable to dwell on our death. But the Christian life does not just encourage us to do so: it demands that we do.

I once came upon a prayer consecrating the last two hours of life to the Blessed Mother. I have since found variations of the prayer online with different phrasing, but the sentiment of them all is the same: let me not be caught sleeping. Let me be ready.

"You can't do all your homework at the end," a deacon who ministers to the dying once told me. "Good Friday is waiting in the wings for all of us."

I think of that a lot when I don't particularly feel like praying, when I think I'm too busy to go to confession or when feelings of resentment fester inside me on Sunday mornings as I pack my family off to church. All our good deeds are like polluted rags, says the prophet. We have all withered like leaves.

You can't do all your homework at the end.
God is faithful. Are we?

*"May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping.
What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!'"*

A Note from the Serra Club of the Tri-Cities:
