Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

He even installed the first printing press in Rome. So it's no surprise that he believed in good communication with God. Through praying the Spiritual Exercises, we notice how God works within us (interior "movements" or feelings), and without (events in the day). "Noticing" alerts us to the various ways in which God communicates with us moment by moment throughout our day. It is how we hear God communicating with us.

Ten Day Spiritual Retreat by Titus Brandsma; taken from *Essays on Titus Brandsma*; Carmelite Media 2004 pages 247-261

Introduction continued {Day I of Retreat}

In the primitive church—at its very foundations—we have an interesting example of a retreat of ten days in close union with Mary. The climax of the retreat was the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles; by the very fact they were transformed into new men. Uniting our prayer to Mary's, let us call down the Holy Spirit: "Come, Holy Ghost, Creator blest, and in our hearts take up thy rest..."

Like the Apostles, we wish to persevere with one mind in prayer with Mary the Mother of Jesus, shielded by trust that, by her intercession, the Spirit of renewal will come down on us, rekindling our cold hearts.

Mary be our Guide...!

Through Mary, by remaining joined to her, we realize we are being led to Jesus. Her arms offer him to us that we love him as she did. Jesus came to us through her. Let us, then, go to Mary, assured that we shall reach Jesus!

We wish to dedicate (this retreat) to meditation on the life of Mary, because in this way we shall be in union with God, and at every moment our gaze shall be riveted on Jesus her Son...to reach a deeper union with God.

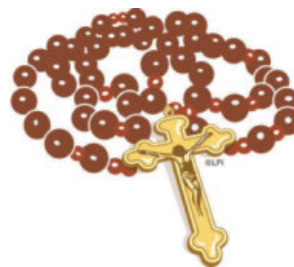

Sunday Reflection

What Have You to Do with Me, Jesus of Nazareth?

Inevitably, when we read the story of the Garden of Eden, my children try to imagine what life would be like if Adam and Eve had not sinned against God.

"Would we have to go to school?" they ask me. "Would we get sick? Could we eat whatever we want? Would we get older?"

I tell them the only thing I know for sure about a world without sin is that we would be happier. I can see confusion in their faces — Why? How? — but I have none of the concrete answers they want. I don't know how to describe a happiness untouched by sin.

The moment sin entered the world, a chasm erupted between God and mankind. There is now a space between humanity and the divine, a cavernous and seemingly impassable void into which God calls for us, unendingly. And because we are lost in the dark, and miserable, instead of following his voice when we hear it, instead we reply: "What do you want?"

"What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?"

Did the unclean spirit know, when he cried out all those thousands of years ago in Capernaum, that he was giving voice to a question which defined the human condition? They are the words of a demon, yes, but they are also my words. Far, far more often than I care to admit, when God is reaching for me, I look upon His hand with contempt and confusion. When I am grappling with a problem or a sin which overwhelms me, again and again I forget that I already know the solution.

The tragedy of original sin is not that we live in a world where we cannot eat what we want, where we age, and where we become sick and die. The tragedy of sin is that we have forgotten how to be happy. We look at happiness and we think: "What do you want with me?"

"If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." — Psalm 95:7
