Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

In Memoriam:

We learned last week of the death of Fr. Gary Norman, who served at Christ the King from 1997 to 2000.

Fr. Norman, a senior priest of the Diocese of Yakima ordained in 1994, died January 31 in Cincinnati, Ohio, while on a preaching trip for Food for the Poor. He had suffered a stroke while being treated for an accident January 22, and diabetes and heart trouble contributed to his death. He was 79. Assignments in the Yakima Diocese included Holy Family Parish in Yakima, Christ the King Parish in Richland, St. Rose of Lima Parish in Ephrata, and St. Joseph Parish in Waterville. He retired in 2014 and had been living in Prescott, Arizona.

The Vigil for Fr. Norman will be Monday, Feb. 12 at 6 p.m. at Saint Paul Cathedral in Yakima, with Msgr. Tom Champoux preaching. The Funeral Mass will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday, February 13, also at Saint Paul. Bishop Joseph Tyson will preside. Burial will follow at Calvary Cemetery, 1405 S 24th Ave. in Yakima.

May Father Gary's soul, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.

Ten Day Spiritual Retreat by Titus Brandsma; taken from *Essays on Titus Brandsma*; Carmelite Media 2004 pages 247-261

Meditations {Day II of Retreat}

Resolution 1: Conversion. Keep our eyes fixed on God. We cannot serve two lords. Far from us all double-dealing, all hypocrisy. We commit ourselves to God joyously and gratefully. Do all that is to be done in his service, to fulfill his will in everything.

Resolution 2: In our weakness, we shall seek our help from God, preferably through the Blessed Sacrament. Here strengthen ourselves every day anew for that one day. "Give us this day our daily bread." Consider our life as a march through the desert toward Horeb to see God there. The future possession and contemplation of God can give our life a new and more pleasing aspect.

Resolution 3: Often remember that God loved us from all eternity, ab aeterno, and has willed to create us. To assure our salvation, he has also willed Mary's Immaculate Conception, ab aeterno. We should see ourselves united to Mary in the eternal plan of God. Frequently humiliate ourselves before God for having despised his love. Invoke and praise the divine mercy. Rejoice in the Immaculate Conception and for the Nativity of Our Lady, as a foreshadowing of our redemption and eternal salvation

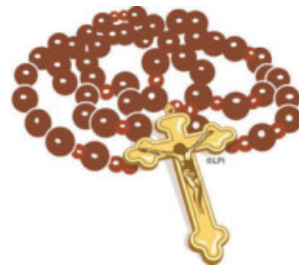

Sunday Reflection

Sin and Loneliness

When I was in high school, we read "The Metamorphosis" by Franz Kafka. It's a depressing little novella about a man who (spoiler alert!) turns into a cockroach and dies of neglect, his family gradually ceasing to recognize the creature he has become.

"Never underestimate how badly human beings need touch," our teacher told us. "Without each other, we curl up and die."

Our need for communion with each other is written into our biology — breathing and heart rate of newborns regulate when they lie against the skin of their mothers, and we instinctively reach out to embrace someone who has been wounded. But it is also written into our souls. Consider the early days of the pandemic, and the emotional starvation we all experienced, prevented from gathering in groups to worship, to celebrate and to mourn. And when we did encounter other people, we kept a mutual distance. "I feel like a leper," we grumbled to our families when we returned home, because we finally understood it: the real tragedy of leprosy is not pain and disfigurement. The real tragedy of leprosy is loneliness.

"If you wish, you can make me clean," begged the leper as he knelt before Christ (Mark 1:40). He wasn't begging for deliverance from pain and disfigurement. He was begging for deliverance from isolation.

"If you wish, you can make me clean," we beg God in confession, not because we are physically withering and dying but because we are so desperate to once again be held in His embrace.

"Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, 'I do will it. Be made clean.'" — Mark 1:41

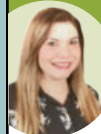
