Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Sunday Reflection

The Angel in the Marble

If you show up to the gates of heaven completely whole, I kind of doubt you'll be let inside.

I know that sounds pretty awful, because what kind of God doesn't want all of you, exactly as you are? "Be yourself," we tell our kids. "If someone expects you to change to be their friend, you don't want to be that person's friend."

And sure, all of that is true ... to an extent. But I think if we really analyze our closest friendships, we'll see that we have been changed by them. We aren't the same person we were on the day we met our best friend or before we fell in love with our spouse. The good relationships should always change us, form us. They should call us to some higher plateau on the mountain climb that is life. But to be nimble enough for the climb, there will be parts of ourselves that we have to jettison — preconceived notions, prejudices, selfish tendencies, habits that we cling to like a security blanket.

This is how we become who we are meant to be: by discerning what isn't helpful and good in our own nature, and letting it go.

"I saw the angel in the marble," Michelangelo once said of his artistic process, "and I carved until I set him free."

Would it not be a terrible tragedy if we all remained shapeless hunks of marble, untouched by the chisels of experience and relationship, thinking ourselves perfect exactly as we are?

God looks at us and he sees the angel hidden in the marble, imprisoned there by the constraints of earthly life: original sin, the weakness of our flesh, the unceasing enticement of the evil one. He sees past what we need to excise, what we need to lop off, what we need to relinquish. He knows we are greatly attached to every part of ourselves, even those parts that lead us to sin.

He sees more than what is. He sees what can be.

Benedictine Spirituality:

Today is September 29; this year the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time but most years the Feast of Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, Archangels. St. Benedict doesn't mention these big three angels in his Rule, but angels do make an appearance. In Chapter 7, on Humility, St. Benedict uses the image of Jacob's Ladder (Gen. 28:12; in Jacob's dream angels were descending and ascending the ladder) to depict progress in the spiritual life.

"Without doubt, this descent and ascent can signify only that we descend by exaltation and ascend by humility. Now the ladder erected is our life on earth, and if we humble our hearts the Lord will raise it to heaven" (RB 7:7-8).

The steps on St. Benedict's ladder include knowledge of and obedience to God's will, repudiation of self indulgence, and perseverance in difficulties. At the height of the ladder, the monk will *"quickly arrive at that perfect love of God which casts out fear.. Through this love, all that he once performed with dread, he will now begin to observe without effort, as though naturally, from habit...out of love for Christ, good habit, and delight in virtue."*

Carmelite Corner

Living in God's Presence (4 of 10)

Excerpts from Chapter 9, *Living in God's Presence, Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey*, edited by Johan Bergstrom-Allen, TOC, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

Carmelites are committed to a life of prayer as the best way of growing more aware of God's presence. Carmelite spirituality can sometimes seem complicated, but it is really very simple....(it) invites us to live within God's presence, to sit at the feet of Jesus, to look at him and to listen to him. Saint Teresa of Jesus (of Avila) said, 'We need no wings to go in search of him but have only to find a place where we can be alone and look upon him present within us.' (The Way of Perfection, Ch. 28). She tells us that getting to know God in prayer is a matter of nurturing a relationship: 'Prayer...is nothing more than an intimate and frequent dialogue of friendship with the one whom we know loves us.' (Life, Ch. 8.5)

In order to appreciate living with God's presence we must learn to know God, and to know God as someone not something. God does not force his presence on us, but invites us to come to know him-to 'come and see' as Jesus said (John 1:39).

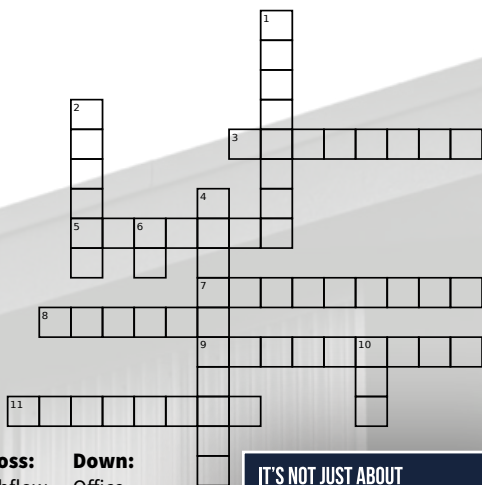
