Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.





Sunday Reflection

The Safety of Darkness

Leprosy and blindness and deafness — oh, my. The disabilities cured by Jesus in his public ministry really are quite something, aren't they? Vividly symbolic and rich food for reflection. It just wouldn't be the same if Jesus had cured eczema or athlete's foot or compulsive nail-biting.

Blind Bartimaeus, sitting by the side of the road, in particular captures my imagination. Because I have a confession to make: sometimes, I like to sit in the darkness, even though I know it isn't very good for me.

Well, listen: it's just easier, isn't it? You don't have to care about or fix the problems you can't see. No one expects you to rush to someone's aid if you don't see their injuries. The darkness is a good place to be, if you don't feel very brave or very smart or very able.

And when Jesus passes you by, if your whole world is darkness, it's easy enough to pretend you just didn't notice him at all.

But Bartimaeus chose not to stay in his darkness. More than that, he cried out to be released from it, even when everyone around him told him to shut up. He was so persistent that he caught the notice of Jesus, and when he heard those words — "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you!" — what did he do? He didn't stammer and run away. He had courage. He got up.

It takes courage to ask for what you need to follow Christ. Because if you ask for it, you'll get it. And then begins the terrifying, wonderful journey of discipleship — testifying to what you have seen. Life in the light, no longer sitting by the side of the road but on the road, journeying toward the greatest destination of all.

"What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asks us.

'Whenever we want to ask some favor of a powerful man, we do it humbly and respectfully, for fear of presumption. How much more important, then, to lay our petitions before the Lord God of all things with the utmost humility and sincere devotion. We must know that God regards our purity of heart and tears of compunction, not our many words. Prayer should therefore be short and pure, unless perhaps it is prolonged under the inspiration of divine grace. In community, however, prayer should always be brief, and when the superior gives the signal, all should rise together."

Living in God's Presence (8 of 10)

Excerpts from Chapter 9, Living in God's Presence, Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey, edited by Johan Bergstrom-Allen, TOC, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

The simplicity of prayer for Brother Lawrence of the Resurrection (1611-91):

The Practice of the Presence of God is a classic of Carmelite wisdom and an international bestseller among both Catholics and Protestants. {Check out this book and other Carmelite books from the CK Parish Library. }

Brother Lawrence realized that prayer can become more complicated than it actually needs to be, and we don't need to use a lot of words.... (He said) "I keep myself in his presence by simple attentiveness and a general loving awareness of God' (letter 2) Lawrence appreciated that prayer is, quite simply, a process of turning our hearts to God in acknowledgment of his presence. This might be for a prolonged period, or just a few seconds, and gradually helps us acquire the habitual attitude of being aware that we are always in God's presence.

Prayer is God's country that we gradually explore. We must put ourselves into his care and allow him to arrange things for us. Prayer is always possible, no matter what we feel like, because God is actually the one reaching out to us before we ever reach out to him. Sometimes offering our emptiness and dryness is enough.


