Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

In today's Gospel, Jesus overcomes the temptations to wealth, power and esteem. As we begin Lent, may we open our hearts to the grace of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

SVdP's unique ability to personally assess and immediately respond to a call for help can so often be the answer to prayer for our neighbors who find themselves suddenly in desperate need for assistance. An unexpected delayed disability check recently left a neighbor unable to purchase an urgently needed prescription medication refill. A three-day supply obtained from an ER visit provided only temporary relief to his unplanned pause in income. A call to SVDP led to the immediate purchase and delivery of a full month's supply of medication, leaving the neighbor relieved and extremely thankful for the blessings of caring neighbors in his community.

Lenten Disciplines: As always, the church asks us to abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent. Good Friday is a day of fasting (i.e., one main meal and two small meals) as well. The obligation to abstain from meat applies to all older than 14; fasting is for adults between the ages of 18 and 59. Circumstances of illness or other dietary needs excuse these obligations.

Ignatian Spirituality:

During Lent, the Spiritual Exercises lead a pray-er through Jesus' passion. Jesus might look passive in his suffering and death, but Ignatius and our faith assure us that Jesus came to earth for this purpose. It was his life's work. In Matthew 26, Jesus institutes the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Ignatius calls the Eucharist the "Greatest mark of God's love." It represents the key to understanding redemption. The Eucharist tells us that God holds nothing back from us. Even before his enemies came for him, Jesus gave us his body and blood as food for our souls. As we pray through this season of Lent, we are reminded again just how much God loves us.

Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa (7 of 12)

While she insisted on up-to-date care that was sometimes groundbreaking, she never ceased to urge the personal touch, reminding the Sisters of what should characterize their ministry:

"I often think of the sacrifices our old people must make, and yet we sometimes feel our life is so difficult. They must leave their houses, familiar surroundings, friends and relatives, and adjust to our homes."

"I cannot stress enough the fact that you be good to the residents in your homes. Try to be kinder than kindness itself. If you fail, let it be on the side of kindness, rather than harshness and neglect. As long as you did it to the least of my brothers, you did it to me, Christ tells us.."

"Unless we use all our love and skill to make the last years golden years, our old people can spend many lonely hours and years before God calls them to their eternal reward.

"The motto of Carmel - 'With zeal have I been zealous for the Lord God of hosts' - should ever be imprinted not only in the heart of each Carmelite, but it should be an outward sign whereby all men know that we firmly believe that with God and Mary on our side we can accomplish even the impossible."
