About the Fr. Tolton Play

Tolton: From Slave to Priest is a powerful one-man multi-media play on the life of Father Augustus Tolton, the first African American priest (1854-1897). Father Tolton's compelling story offers encouragement and hope to our world, so desperately in need of reconciliation and healing. It is much more than an inspirational story – Father Tolton's example offers a key to unlocking the divisions that plaque our society.

In **Tolton: From Slave to Priest**, you might hear words, common in the late 1800s yet highly objectionable today, describing people of African heritage. Some of these terms were very offensive and derogatory even then. Bishop Joseph Perry, the postulator for Father Tolton's cause for sainthood, reviewed the script for Tolton and encouraged us not to shy away from the reality of abuse and insults that Father Tolton suffered, but to use the actual language he would have heard.

The play features a full cast of characters on a video screen who interact with actor Jim Coleman live on stage. This unique format is visually engaging while also retaining the personal effect of a live performance. Audiences leave the show feeling that they have "met" Father Tolton. The production is enhanced by an original soundtrack based on traditional African American spirituals, orchestrated by composer Tony Manfredonia.

Drop Your Nets and Be Free

There are times I wish I had no obligations. It would be great to take my wife's hand, hop in the car, and drive into the sunset. Where we were going would not matter as much as the fact that we would have nowhere we had to be. There would be nothing we had to do. No bills. No commitments. No problems. Freedom!

Life doesn't work like that, however. When Jesus came along and asked some fishermen to drop their nets and follow him, they did just that. Wow! In some ways, they experienced true freedom. That is what Jesus offers all of us. Yet, true freedom looks quite different than my dream scenario.

In living in the true freedom that Jesus offers, there are things we must do and places we must go. That is because freedom only exists in following God's will, not our own. We are called to be and called to give ourselves completely to God without reservations. We always have the free will to not respond to His call, but we will find that a negative answer may complicate our lives even further. God's path for us calls on us to give freely of what we have been given. Saying no to that call means we carry the weight of those gifts. We were never meant to keep them. The path of God's will may seem long and winding, but it is the one that leads us into that sunset. It is the way to true freedom.


