Carmelite Corner

Wisdom of Carmelite Saints:

St. Mary Magdalene's de' Pazzi (1566-1607).

St. Mary Magdalene's de' Pazzi was born in Florence, Italy in 1566, and was taught mental prayer when she was nine. Mary Magdalene was given a good education and, from her childhood, she had a deep sense of the presence of God, a great love for the Eucharist and a longing to live a penitential life. She entered a contemplative monastery of the Carmelite Order; the monastery of St. Mary's of the Angels because the nuns took daily Communion, unusual at the time.

From the time of her clothing with the religious habit till her death the saint's life was one series of raptures and ecstasies. She was interested in a renewal of the Catholic Church that focused on "conversion" of the heart. "The central theme in her spirituality was love; we are created by God with love and by love, and such is the means by which we must turn to him; love is the measure of how far the soul has returned to God. The principal function of love is to unite the soul to God."

A Call to Respect Life and Serve Families in Need

"Defense of unborn life is closely linked to the defense of each and every other human right. It involves the conviction that a human being is always sacred and inviolable, in any situation and at every stage of development."

- Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium

Respecting the dignity of every human life from conception to natural death is a core tenet of our Catholic faith. This conviction compels us to seek justice and advocate for the vulnerable, the voiceless, and the afflicted. Upholding the dignity of every human person drives us to care for the poor, to welcome immigrants, to seek racial and social justice, and to oppose abortion. We commend the Supreme Court's decision to overturn *Roe v. Wade* and give individual states the opportunity to enact laws that respect life. We welcome this opportunity to reduce the number of abortions in the United States and build a culture of life.

Due to laws passed prior to *Roe*, abortion remains legal in Washington state. Regardless of the legal status of abortion, the Church's call to respect life remains unchanged. We must continue not only to speak out against abortion, but also to care for mothers who face unplanned or challenging pregnancies. As mothers and families choose life under difficult circumstances, we are called to accompany them on their journey and to do all we can to support them and their children. Advocating for life does not end with the birth of a child. Respecting the dignity of every human person means ensuring that families' basic needs are met and that they are given the opportunity to thrive.

At this time, we invite all Catholic parishes, institutions, organizations, and individuals to redouble efforts to accompany women and couples confronted with unexpected or difficult pregnancies. Many Catholic programs throughout the state provide assistance, accompaniment, and mentorship to vulnerable families as they nurture their children from pregnancy through early childhood. Now is the time for the faithful to offer a viable alternative to abortion by increasing efforts to serve families in need. Contact the <u>Washington State Catholic Conference</u> (WSCC) to learn more.

Much work remains to build a culture of life in our state. Through the Washington State Catholic Conference, we will continue to advocate for public policies that support life and help struggling families thrive. Please join us in <u>advocating</u> for the common good. Finally, we invite you to pray

with us that all will one day recognize that every human life is sacred and deserving of reverence, protection, and assistance in times of need.
