Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.





Loving as New Creations

"There's something different about you."

Think about the times in your life when this has been said to you. Maybe it was after someone complimented you on a job well done, and you realized that you were walking through life with a little more confidence. Maybe it was after meeting someone special, as you carried the glow of that relationship wherever you went. Chances are, if someone has noticed something different about you, it's because, inwardly, you've been changed by the loving or respectful actions of another person.

Love, you see, can make us into new creations. From the love of God flows the grace to tackle any challenge, including the biggest challenge of all: loving each other well. Christ knows what a big request this is. He was human, too. He came and lived among us. He knew intimately what it was to love people in the chaos of their own flaws. Eucharistic Miracles

Eucharistic Miracles of the World!

St. Satyrus (Italy, 4th century) is our Eucharistic Miracle saint for the week. St. Ambrose (his brother) wrote of him "Before being fully initiated into the sublime mysteries (First Communion), he experienced a shipwreck... while all round the waves were tearing [his ship] apart, he was not afraid of dying but of having to leave his life without having been nourished by [the Eucharist]...So he asked for the Eucharist ... and placed [it] in a handkerchief, which he hung around his neck. Then he threw himself into the sea and looked for a plank loosed from the hulk of the ship to hang onto..." (The Eucharistic Miracles of the World, 329) He did indeed reach land and when realizing he was saved went straight to the closest church to receive his First Holy Communion.

New miracles are on display in the Gathering Space including some from Santerem, Portugal; Caravaca, Spain; and Bordeaux, France!
