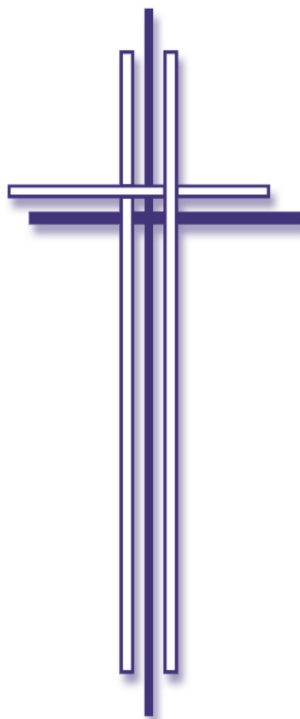

Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Sunday Reflection

The View from the Back of the Line

Have you known that person? The one who leaves every person they encounter feeling a little more blessed for having met them? They're the friend you can count on when nothing is going well. They're the one who's always "doing" for others. They're never gossiping or sniping or complaining.

We wonder how they do it, how they have it in them. We're a little envious, even if we don't let ourselves acknowledge it.

That, folks, is what the view is like from the front of the line, gazing at those suckers in the way back and wondering why they're smiling so much.

We've all been at the front of a line and felt no shame about it. We show up early, we put in the time and the legwork, and we "earn" whatever it is we came for — sports tickets, the latest Apple product, whatever. That's how it works here on Earth, where the fastest win the race, the fittest survive and the first shall be first, always.

It's exactly why stewardship is such a tall order. Stewardship calls us to play by the rules of another kingdom — one where the richest have the least amount in their bank accounts and the happiest don't seem to have anything to show for it, at least materially.

If you have a person in your life who always seems happy "doing" for others, it's because by a boatload of God's grace, they play by the rules of the other place.

Watch and take notes — and don't be afraid to join them at the back of the line.

He devotes Chapter 63 to 'the rank in the community;' the monk's date of entry to the community establishes his place in the order, but Benedict also commands each monk to show deference to the other.

Carmelite Corner

Living in God's Presence (9 of 10)
Excerpts from Chapter 9, *Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey*, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

The simplicity of prayer for Saint Thérèse (The Little Flower): St. Thérèse of Lisieux (d. 1897) wrote: 'For me, prayer is an aspiration of the heart, it is a simple glance directed to heaven, it is a cry of gratitude and love in the midst of trial as well as joy, which expands my soul and unites me to Jesus.' This *prayer of aspiration* has long been favored by Carmelites as a way to take up Saint Paul's injunction to 'Pray without ceasing' (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and continually acknowledge God's presence in our hearts. It is a way of keeping vigil with God, of 'keeping watch in prayer' as Saint Albert stated in Chapter 10 of (the Carmelite) *Rule*.

The word *aspiration* means 'the action of breathing' as well as 'the action of desiring'. The *prayer of aspiration* reflects both these meanings: with every breath we take we are in the presence of God who breathed life into the world, the God whom we desire. Lawrence and Thérèse encourage us to pray as we can, pray as we are, and pray where we are. We have feelings and emotions and we tend to rely on these as guides to how 'successful' our prayer is, but (they) knew that it was God who was working in them when they prayed, whether they felt it or not.
