#### **Practicing Graciousness in the Desert**

Looking back over my journey of parenthood, I know there were days when I traveled the extra mile for my children. I made their toast the way they like it, let them play in the park an extra ten minutes, or let them go to the movies with their friends and I finished up the chores on my own. And then, it happened: the attitude. The request for the smallest thing from one of them is met with disdain or bewilderment.

Sometimes you can be made breathless with the ingratitude of another person who takes so much and with so little shame, only to scoff at the idea that they, too, give even the smallest amount.

But if we're being honest with ourselves, we will admit that we do the exact same thing to God. Haven't we all been the Israelites in the desert at one point or another? God has parted our Red Sea in some way. He's led us out of some great trial, given us some great blessings. But then we run into a little resistance somewhere along the way and we throw up our hands. How could you do this to us, Lord? How could you ask this of us? No, I can't go any further. No, I won't do any more.

Persisting in the blindness to the many ways God continues to protect us is nothing short of a temper tantrum. It robs our Everyday Stewardship of its graciousness, of our ability to accept with joy the trials of life because we are also constantly aware of its blessings.

#### Carmelite Corner

Living in God's Presence (2 of 10) Excerpts from Chapter 9, Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

All are called to holiness. Vatican II's Lumen Gentium, says, "The Lord Jesus...preached holiness of life to each and every one of His disciples, regardless of their situation" (§40). God's presence is holiness. St. JPII said, 'Friendship with Christ is the start of holiness.' God wants to communicate with us, to nourish a relationship with us. God never forces his presence upon us, but continually invites us to discover his presence in a variety of ways. To enjoy God's presence is a gift freely offered by God, not something we achieve on our own. By seeking God with a pure heart and a spirit of humility, God raises us to intimate knowledge of Himself. Seeking to live with God's presence is not simply a matter of doing 'holy things'. God is present in all aspects of our lives, not simply the 'religious' or 'pious' parts of it. There should be no divide between 'the spiritual life' and 'the rest of life', since it is all lived in the presence of God.

#### **Atomic Cities Peace Memorial ceremony:**

Tuesday, August 10, 8:00 p.m., in the Activity Room of the Richland Community Center in Howard Amon Park, commemorating the Nagasaki atomic bombing and sponsored by World Citizens for Peace.

The one-hour program of song, speech and prayer will remember the past with hope for the future. Highlight of the ceremony will be ringing of the "Bell of Peace" model – a model of the Angelus bell recovered from ruins of the Immaculate Conception Cathedral near ground zero.

The bell model was a gift from the Catholic mayor of Nagasaki to the people of Richland in 1985. In accordance with the Memorial's theme of reconciliation, the bell will be rung in memory of those who died on both sides of the war – the Americans who died at Pearl Harbor as well as the Japanese who died in Nagasaki.

Nagasaki is the center of Catholicism in Japan, going back to the missionary work of St. Francis Xavier in 1549. For further information, go to: wcpeace.org.


