Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

**Celebration of Christian Funeral:** After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

**Christian Initiation of Adults:** Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

**Christian Initiation of Children (CIC):** We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

#### **Sunday Reflection**

#### If Heaven were like Harvard

There's no getting around it: life on earth can seem easier if you're rich. Most of the bodily and material needs a person could have are fulfilled if you've got a little bit of money behind you. So why doesn't this same theory apply to entering the kingdom of Heaven? Why isn't Heaven like an Ivy League school, where a connection and a hefty tuition check might open a lot of doors?

When you think about it, the virtues required to enter Heaven — things like charity and justice and courage — should be even closer within the grasp of those who never had to worry about where their food is coming from. In theory, your capacity for good works should only increase with the resources at your disposal.

The same is true for stewardship potential. Let's say I've got a lot of talent. Maybe I've got a lot of free time. On paper, it should be easier for me to give freely of these gifts, because I have the luxury that eluded the widow and her two coins: I can see my ample gift being put into action, when so many can only offer what they have and remind themselves that God sees it and appreciates it.

But here we get into the mess of humanity: if we have a lot of something, it means we have a lot of something we could use any way we want. And then we hear the whisper of the serpent: Think of what this (money, time, talent) could do for you.

May we pray for God to give us the heart of the widow, no matter our resources.

#### **Ignatian Spirituality**

To discern God's will, the first thing we must do is practice the first commandment: "You shall have no other gods before me." When we take something that is not Godly, and make it most important, that goes against the First Commandment. The Catechism says: "idolatry not only refers to false pagan worship. It remains a constant temptation to faith." The Spiritual Exercises help each person recognize the things that he or she is overly attached to, the things that take the place of God, or keep a person from turning to God. For instance, we might choose comfort and sleep when called to prayer, or excuse our attachment to food, money or shopping as normal and cultural, or perhaps even necessary for mental health. Throughout this section of the retreat, people are praying that God open their eyes to the things they are attached to, and praying for the grace to turn to God instead.

#### Carmelite Corner

Excerpts from **St. Joseph, Patron of Carmel**: by Prior General, Miceái O'Neill, O Carm. and Superior General, Saverio Cannistrà, OCD; The Sword, V80, #2, 2020

Devotion to St. Joseph among Carmelites had liturgical overtones from the very beginning. In later times, and right up to the present day, we find also a Eucharistic dimension in Carmelite devotion to St. Joseph, as the one who held in his hands the bread of life, our spiritual food and drink.

In truth, it is impossible to say exactly when people began to celebrate the feast of St. Joseph in Carmelite churches. In all probability, as early as the 14th century, there was strong local devotion. But by the 15<sup>th</sup> century we begin to see a Mass and a Divine Office proper to St. Joseph. The Flemish Carmelite, Arnold Bostius, in 1476, stated that Carmelites had a solemn celebration of his feast. The proper of the liturgy in honour of St. Joseph in the Carmelite tradition is thought by historians and liturgists to be the first monument of the Latin Church to the dignity of St. Joseph.


