Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Mass Attendance Protocols: As we enter the 'open' world again, we will re-introduce our Mass practices gradually. For now, here are the protocols:

Sunday Reflection

The Steward's Work Is Never Done

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?

Excerpts from *The Fundamental Elements of Carmelite Spirituality*, Joseph Chalmers, O. Carm., (Prior General at that time) *Carmel in the World 2000*, Vol XXXIX, #3 (4 of 4)

Like the journeys of our forerunners St Elijah, St. John of the Cross, or St. Therese of Avila, modern day Carmelites must too past by way of the desert, through the dark night of the soul and delve interiorly to prepare to meet God in the sound of the gentle breeze or the peacefulness of silence. Supporting the Carmelite vocation are the scriptural readings and prayers found in the Liturgy of the Hours (the most powerful prayers of the Church, second only to the Mass), the study of scripture (the *Lectio Divina*), the Sacraments of the Church, and the writings of the saints.

Carmelite Spirituality is synonymous with prayer, contemplation and service. We are invited to an intimate relationship with God in the midst of our busy lives; He asks only for our consent. With this relationship at the center of our being, all our activity will become all the more fruitful.
