Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 4 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Bride's Room). Registration for the class is required.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting that their wedding take place at Christ the King must fill out an application (available on our website or in the parish office). The application must be submitted at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date to allow time for marriage preparation. The form includes information about fees.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the OCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1675 for information.

of uncertain duration. He had already moved from a
rented house to the cheapest RV park he could find but
within a few months was having trouble paying even

his disability application to be processed.

Part time position from September through May. Three
hours per week on Sundays from 8:00-11:00 a.m.

Excerpts from *Nine Themes in Carmelite Spirituality*, Fr. Patrick McMahon, O. Carm., www.ocarm.org

Carmel is Christocentric, continued

St. Teresa advises us that the humanity of Christ should be a constant source for our meditation. We should focus on his fears in the garden as he struggled to be faithful to his Father's will. We should focus on his bewilderment that he had been obedient to his Father's will, but his faithfulness led not to glory but to shame - or so it would have seemed on that Good Friday. We should focus on his sense of abandonment by his friends. We should focus on the trial of faith he underwent in his passion.

We need to know that as the author of the Letter to the Hebrews tells us that he was tempted in every way that we are, and we need to know as Paul tells us in the Letter to the Philippians that he did not consider his equality with God something to cling to, but he emptied himself taking on himself the nature of a slave being born in human estate. To understand our vocation as Carmelites we need to identify with Jesus as he goes into the desert for forty days to discover his father's plan for him. We need to go with him up the mountain to spend the night in prayer. We need to go with him to the lonely place where we, like he did, can search our lives to see if we are still on track with God the Father's will
