Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 4 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Bride's Room). Registration for the class is required.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting that their wedding take place at Christ the King must fill out an application (available on our website or in the parish office). The application must be submitted at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date to allow time for marriage preparation. The form includes information about fees.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the OCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1675 for information.

Carmel is in the classic Catholic Tradition

Our past defines and shapes our present. We cannot understand our present unless we go back to our past. ...We Catholics must not lose the rich treasure we have in our theological tradition, a tradition dating not to the 1950s or even to the early part of the last century, but a tradition that dates back almost twenty centuries.

One practical introduction to the Fathers of the Church and the Doctors of the Church, in this treasury of Christian literature, is in the Divine Office, which contains many fine sections of this classical Catholic tradition in the daily Office of Readings. Our faith will be much richer and deeper as we become more familiar with the thoughts of the men and women who were part of the great chain of Christians who received the faith from the apostles and handed it on to us..


